The math institutes have taken the lead in promoting closer ties between universities and industry, and it is important that math departments become aware of the dynamics of these important initiatives. We have been able to attract Rob Calderbank, who had a particularly good vantage point to follow the dynamics on the interface between mathematics departments and industry. Rob was formerly Vice President, Research, of A T & T; he will report on the difficulties Bell Labs recently came face-to-face with, and how these calamitous events will result in out-sourcing of industrial research. MITACS is the other main contributor for the Saturday Special Session – the contributors will describe how MITACS is shaping the university-industry interface.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE:

Participants should arrive on Thursday afternoon for a 4pm check-in at the Front Desk of the Professional Development Centre. The formal part of the program will begin on Friday morning; check-out is noon, Saturday.

ACCOMODATIONS:

Guests of the BIRS 2-day Workshops will be staying in Corbett Hall, as guests of BIRS. Each bedroom has one queen bed along with one desk with a Sun Ray Terminal ("thin client") and an ethernet port for Internet access with your laptop. A bathroom is shared between two guest rooms.

Breakfast on Friday and Saturday are covered by BIRS – a continental breakfast in the BIRS Lounge in Corbett Hall. Lunches and dinners are in the Main Dining Room of Donald Cameron Hall. The buffet lunch is \$12 for BIRS participants and runs from 11:30 am-1:30 pm; the dinner is \$22 and runs from 5:30-7:30 pm; these charges will be added to your room bill. There are also many restaurants in the town of Banff.

Spouses are welcomed at BIRS. If you come with your spouse an \$11 fee will be added to your room bill, to cover the breakfast and a service charge.

If you would like to stay an extra night or two in Banff you must make your own arrangements. Since Corbett Hall, the site of BIRS, will be in use for other scheduled workshops, you will need to either change buildings in the Banff Centre or book elsewhere in Banff. If you are planning to bring your entire family the Banff Centre itself (in which BIRS is located) has guest facilities for families.
